Poster Submission

All participants are invited to showcase and share their transformative practices in learning and teaching by submitting a printed and digital poster to the Celebrating Transformative Education Conference (CTEC - 2024). This is an opportunity to present your innovative approaches, research findings, and practical applications that have contributed to the evolution of education. Topics include, but are not limited to:

- **Curriculum Transformations:** Exploring new frameworks and content that meet the evolving needs of students and society.
- Assessment Transformations: Innovative assessment methods that better evaluate student learning and outcomes.
- **Teaching Transformations:** New teaching strategies that enhance engagement and effectiveness in diverse learning environments.
- **Resource Transformations:** Creative use of resources to support and enrich the learning experience.
- **Technological Transformations:** Integration of new technologies to facilitate and improve educational practices.

Guidelines

- Eligibility: Open to all teaching and research staff, as well as HDR students.
- **Abstract Guidelines:** A maximum of 250 words to be submitted with information about the poster.
- Formats: Posters should be designed for printing in A1 size and submitted digitally in JPEG or PDF formats (Less than 10 MB).
- **Poster Content:** Include a clear title, the abstract, key words, methods or process, findings and/or recommendations, and key references.
- **Design:** Posters should be engaging and accessible for a broad academic and professional audience.

- Poster Abstract (250 words Max) Submission Deadline: 19 August 2024
- Notification of Acceptance: 26 August 2024
- Submission of Digital and Printed Poster: 4 October 2024
